Intake

- Residents are connected to WSA
- WSA vets the call to ensure it is a right fit
- Key information is shared with the RSA Group Leader



Assignment

- The RSA Group leader assigns the RSA based on:
 - Location
 - Issue
 - Availability




Pre-Site Visit

- Scheduling
- Desk Assessment



Site Visit/Resident Interview

- Residents get a hand off packet
- Stewards interview the resident and use the RSA form to assess the site



The Follow Up

- The RSA Group Member prepares the follow up letter
- The follow up email is sent to the resident
- Logging and reporting



Things To Keep In Mind

- RSAs typically take about 10 hours
- Count towards action hours
- A great way to reinforce certification knowledge
