Social Diffusion/Commitment Visual

Outreach Tool: Mobilize the community to embrace tree planting by encouraging participants to create or download a certificate marking their tree planting. Make these visible to the community, along with instructions on how to participate. Posting the certificates on a tree campaign wall decoration is one way to visually show the community mobilizing to care for trees. Alternatively, this visual commitment tool can be modified to be virtual. The congregation could create a tree campaign website and ask members to email the coordinator a copy of the cerficate so that their names can be listed on the website. For effective social diffusion, it is important to make sure the web page display is prominently visible to all along with instructions on how to participate. Include participation modifications to ensure all congregants can get involved in the community's effort, regardless of, for example, Internet access or capacity to donate to a tree planting service. (Social Diffusion) (Commitment)



DID YOU KNOW?

- There used to be about 6 trillion trees on Earth.
 Today, only about 3 trillion trees remain, and despite significant efforts, we continue to lose about 15 billion trees every year.¹
 - Trees remove pollution to provide cleaner air and improved health.
- Trees filter the water we drink and prevent flooding and erosion.
- Trees reduce effects of climate change.
- Trees provide homes for thousands of species of plants and animals.^{2,3}
- Trees are beautiful!

- **Outreach Tool:** This message can be used in the congregation's newsletter or on the congregation's website to communicate and/or entice members of the congregation to help plant trees and provide ongoing tree care. (Communications) (Social Diffusion)
- Accompanying Messages:
 - The messages included in the above example newsletter article can be tailored for your congregation.
 - Ask a member of your congregation if he/she would like to be featured with a photo and a quote in the article. Feature members known for a congregational leadership role that is not related to the environment, as the element of surprise can catch people's attention.
 - Preserve our community. Plant a tree. Help promote our community's quality of life by expanding and protecting our shade cover. Trees, along with green space and parks, promote physical activity and reduce stress. (stewardship)
 - Care for a street tree. Help newly planted street trees become established and thrive. Caring for a tree during its establishment period (2-3 years) increases the likelihood of its survival. (stewardship)
- Resources:
 - Promote a day of tree planting and preservation in your community. The Watershed Stewards Academy started a <u>community-based tree planting program</u> in 2020. Anne Arundel County communities of all types, including neighborhoods, congregations, schools and others, are invited to apply. Another option is to contact <u>Tree-mendous</u> <u>Maryland</u>, a popular program of the Maryland Forest Service aimed at helping citizens restore tree cover on public land and community open space.
 - Encourage congregants to adopt-a-tree in their neighborhood. Work with your local department of public works to support municipal street trees and help maintain a healthy, vibrant urban forest. Some communities have adopt-a-tree programs but even if yours does not, low-cost tree watering bags are available at retail stores and provide a way for congregants to take local action to adopt-a-tree.
